The play “Dracula” follows the iconic vampire’s journey from Transylvania to England, where he attempts to spread his undead curse and find new victims. A group of protagonists, including Jonathan Harker, Mina Murray, and Dr. Van Helsing, unite to thwart Dracula’s plans, battling his supernatural powers and ultimately destroying him. The play explores themes of good versus evil, temptation, and the fight against the supernatural.

Novel written by Irish author Bram Stoker in 1897. The stage play was first written by the Irish actor and playwright Hamilton Dean in 1924 and then revised by the American writer John L. Balderston in 1927.

Director's Note I have always been interested in horror movies. Especially the black and white classic horror movies from the 1920's-1930's. Gothic tales of misfits and monsters. Movies like Nosferatu, Frankenstein, The Bride of Frankenstein, Freaks and Dracula had an influence on me. These movies and ones by Tim Burton helped to form my design aesthetic. Seeing another High School perform a different version of Dracula last year at Thescon and watching last year's movie Nosferatu gave Ms. Almond and myself the idea to bring this story to our stage. We are excited to bring it to you and the cast and crew hope you enjoy our production of Dracula.

Bram Stoker (born November 8, 1847, Clontarf, County Dublin, Ireland—died April 20, 1912, London, England) was an Irish writer best known as the author of the Gothic horror tale Dracula (1897). Stoker was the third of seven children. Due to illness, Stoker could not stand or walk until he was seven years old, and he was subjected to common treatments of the time such as bloodletting. He went on to become an outstanding athlete and football (soccer) player at Trinity College (1864–70) in Dublin, where he earned a degree in mathematics. After 10 years in the civil service at Dublin Castle, during which he was also an unpaid drama critic for the Dublin Evening Mail (later the Evening Mail), Stoker made the acquaintance of his idol, actor Sir Henry Irving. From 1878 until Irving's death 27 years later, he was Irving's manager, writing as many as 50 letters a day for him and accompanying him on his American tours. Turning to fiction later in life, he published his first novel, The Snake's Pass, a romantic thriller set among the bleak landscape of western Ireland, in 1890.




WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST
